Rimba Raya Biodiversity Reserve, an InfiniteEARTH Project, achieves another major milestone, becoming the first REDD+ project in the world to be audited for UN Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) compliance under the Sustainable Development Verified Impact Standard (SD VISta Standard) - achieving the highest possible rating of contributing to all 17 UN SDGs



Rimba Raya Biodiversity Reserve Audited by AENOR





In January 2020, a rigorous external audit was conducted by AENOR at our project, the Rimba Raya Biodiversity Reserve Project, located in Central Kalimantan (Indonesia).

The main objective of the verification was to conduct an independent assessment in order to determine compliance with the requirements of the Sustainable Development Verified Impact Standard (SD VISta).

The scope of the verification included a review of the sustainable development impacts generated by the project during the monitoring period and our contribution to the UN SDGs which have a beneficial impact on the community members, including their financial prosperity.

Additionally, the project was being evaluated for its significant contribution to the protection of habitat and biodiversity.

First REDD+ Project to be validated

This is the first REDD+ project to be validated under the SD VISta Program as having contributed to the achievement of all 17 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through the positive impacts generated by the project activities.

The initiatives introduced prevent deforestation and land use change and encourage community development and economic growth.

This verification has only been possible thanks to the combined efforts of all stakeholders including the community members, local government, our business partners and a strong partnership between Rimba Raya and InfiniteEARTH.





InfiniteEARTH



The project was initiated by InfiniteEARTH with the purpose of reducing emissions in Indonesia by conserving almost 65,000 hectares which encompasses large areas of tropical peat swamp forest.

This action was vital in our efforts to prevent the conversion of the entire area into an oil palm plantation, which would certainly have led to additional forest degradation within the adjacent national park and consequent loss of biodiversity and habitat, particularly for the endangered Bornean orangutan and other vulnerable animals listed on the IUCN Red list of endangered species.




Over the years, InfiniteEARTH has used the sustainable revenue stream from the sale of carbon credits to introduce several economic incentives which are aimed at promoting community development, provincial government infrastructure and project area protection.

An important additional benefit of our project is the protection of the valuable biodiversity found in the adjacent Tanjung Puting National Park. The area on the Eastern border of the project creates a physical buffer zone between the park and a sea of oil palm plantations.
