SUSTAINABILITY

According to the United Nations, forests cover 30.7 per cent of the Earth's surface. Forests don't only provide food security and shelter, they are key to combating climate change, protecting biodiversity and the homes of indigenous populations.

By protecting forests, we will also be able to strengthen natural resource management and increase land productivity.

Orangutans are the world's largest tree-climbing mammals. But their forest habitat in Indonesia and Malaysia is rapidly disappearing, putting the future of Asia's only great ape in peril.

At least 100,000 of these orangutans have disappeared over the past 16 years.

OUR FOREST HAS IMMEASURABLE VALUE

Rimba Raya Biodiversity Reserve, 64,500 ha of High Conservation Value (HCV) forest, is one of the most highly endangered ecosystems in the world.

Our contribution over the years has prevented this forest from being slashed, burned and converted to oil palm, thereby preventing 130M tonnes of emissions.

We form a vital patrolled buffer zone between the ever-encroaching bulldozers of the palm oil industry and the Tanjung Puting National Park, home to one of the last remaining wild populations of orangutans on earth.

GOAL

Our long-term goal will be to ensure that our peat swamp forest remains intact for future generations. This can only happen if we work in partnership with local stakeholders who must allocate value to a natural commodity that they have until now, taken for granted.

We will continue to keep this forest standing as habitat for endangered wildlife and to provide natural resources to the community in a sustainable way.

Every attempt is made to inform and educate the public to ensure that they are aware that their actions have far and long reaching consequences but that we are doing this in partnership as we share a common goal.

WHAT WE DO



Rimba Raya is home to over

- 300 species of birds
- 122 species of mammals
- 180 species of trees and plants

While preserving a forest that shelters all these animal species, we maintain a special commitment to the protection of the endangered Bornean Orangutan.

The sale of carbon credits enables us to make significant contributions to Orangutan Foundation International (OFI), with whom we have a conservation partnership. OFI is fully committed to the rehabilitating all rescued orangutans that are victims of either the pet trade or deforestation and consequent loss of habitat caused by irresponsible and illegal land clearing for industrial agricultural purposes - mostly oil palm.

We provide an area in our concession that is primary peat swamp forest that is ideal orangutan habitat and we have funded the construction of a 1KM long boardwalk, a permanent Ranger Station & Release Camp. We call this release area, "Camp Rimba."

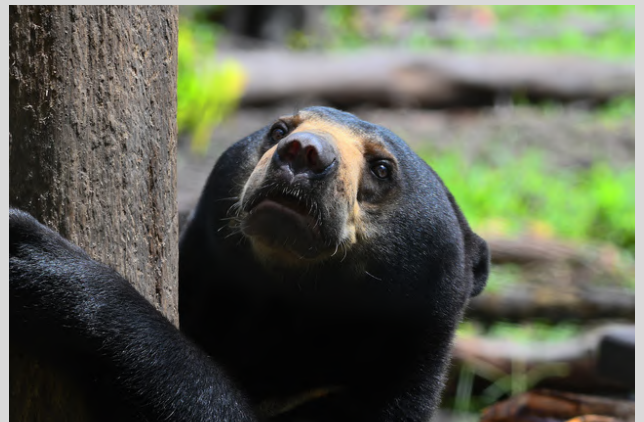

We all benefit from the actions of entities that have implemented a conservation model that protects wildlife, forests and the communities that depend on them.

We protect an area in our concession that is primary peat swamp forest, ideal orangutan and wildlife habitat.

Having funded the construction of a long boardwalk, into the depths of the forest, we've created a protected and remote release area which we call "Camp Rimba". This has led to the development of a permanently staffed Ranger Station which is necessary in order to keep an eye on the status of the released orangutans and also acts as an outlook post for fires or other forest threats.

To date, we have been able to facilitate the repatriation of more than 45 individuals from the Orangutan Foundation International (OFI) Care Center. This is now their new 'Home' as they relearn to live in the wild. A feeding platform, deep in the peat forest, is a meeting point for these and other orangutans, a place to gather, groom one another, forage, and socialize.



Proboscis monkeys have been particularly impacted by the deforestation in Borneo, Peat swamp forests are key habitats for these unique animals which are found only in coastal and river habitats in Borneo. They build nests and sleep in tall trees along the rivers. They coexist well with the orangutans in our concession. Sadly Proboscis monkeys are an endangered species with an estimated 7,000 left in wild while Orangutans are considered critically endangered. The Sun Bear is listed as 'vulnerable' on the IUCN Red List. Protecting our forest protects a plethora of endangered species.

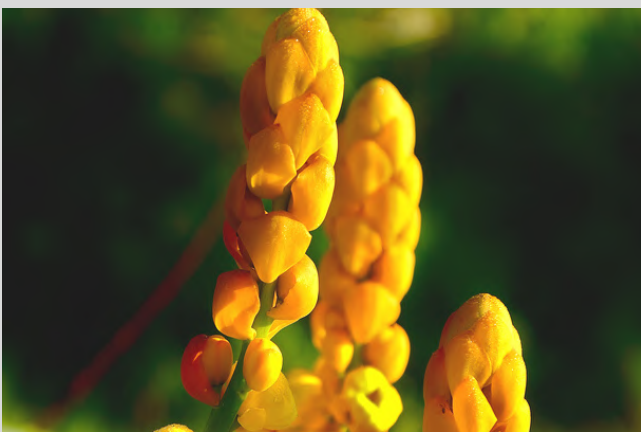
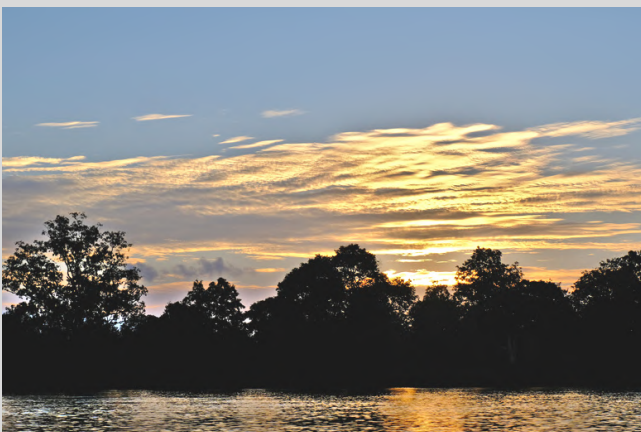
